

Fight'n Cow Call

When cow elk talk to each other, it can mean many things. If they are feeding, that's one sound. If they are lost, that's another sound. But when they are fighting, that's a completely different sound. There's more action in that sound, and that's the sound that you want.

Insert reed end of the call in your mouth with reed facing up. Apply pressure to reed with teeth or lips.

While learning to use this call, your first sounds will probably be like a high pitch duck call. If so, put a lot of pressure on the end of the reed and blow. If no sound, ease off the pressure until you get the desired high pitch sound.

Here's the key. You want to make high pitch cow sounds. Extend the length of the sound with several ups and downs, like EEEEEEE AHAHAH EEEEEEE AHAHAH. Getting the high pitch at the beginning will make this call extremely effective. The Secret...when cow elk fight, they stand on their hind legs. You can make that same action-packed sound by adding some "jerky" air to your blowing. You can use the Fight'n Cow Call with regular cow calls and bugles to "add fuel to the fire."
