

## Instructions

Hunter's Specialties' line of AlumIStrut diaphragm calls combine high quality and consistency with the ultimate in comfort and fit. The aluminum frames are designed to maintain the exact tensions required for consistent performance in the field.

1. With the open end of the horseshoe facing out, insert diaphragm call into mouth and onto upper palate. The small bump on the call should be "down."
2. Place center of tongue on latex and push firmly against roof of mouth with tip of tongue against the bottom of your front teeth. Before attempting any sounds, practice tolerating and controlling the call as it's placed on the roof of your mouth.
3. The first sound is produced by "huffing" or blowing air over your tongue and across the latex reeds of the call. High notes require more pressure on the latex; lower notes are achieved by decreasing the pressure.
4. The basic "yelp" is a two-note call blended together to sound as one. The high note or "kee" is made by forcing air across the reeds while applying pressure to the latex. The second note - "yoke" - is made by dropping your jaw and relaxing the pressure on the reeds slightly, but not entirely. With practice, you'll be able to blend the two sounds - "kee-yoke" - together and sound a true yelp.

### Maintenance and Care

- \* Do not leave diaphragms in direct sunlight. Keep away from heat.
- \* Store in refrigerator when not in use.
- \* Do not alter reeds.
- \* Tape can be trimmed for a better fit. Trim small amounts at first.
- \* Practice indoors and out; sounds may vary.
- \* **Use caution to prevent the chance of choking on call.**
