

Instructions

Hold Yelper firmly in either hand, placing index finger on the front end of the acrylic striker rod. Cup hand around bottom of call to create a sound chamber (see picture).

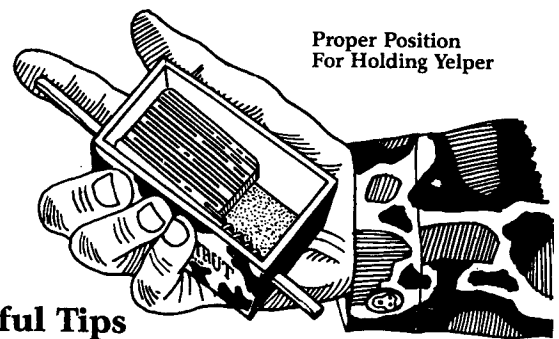
Yelp The universal sound of the wild turkey. A high-low sound. Sound is pronounced “yee--elp” and should be made in succession as “yelp-yelp-yelp-yelp.” To reproduce: simply push rod in and let it return while lightly keeping finger on rod. Repeat in desired succession.

Cluck Close range hen talk that's soft and shows contentment. Good to bring “toms” in during spring. To reproduce: a quick tap of the striker is all that's needed.

Cackle A very excited hen. Very rapid yelping. Going up the scale then back down. To reproduce: push striker rod with a quick short rhythm, extending the length of strokes after 4 or 5 short ones.

Helpful Tips

- While the all-acrylic construction of the “Push Button Yelper” makes the caller impervious to the elements, it is important to keep the calling surfaces free of dirt, debris and moisture. Should either friction surface get fouled, simply turn the striker paddle to an upright position and clean or sand the surfaces.
- Avoid touching calling surfaces directly with your fingers; body oils can cause the call to skip.
- Keep the striker well sanded at all times. To sand the friction surface, turn the paddle to an upright position and lightly sand with cross-grain strokes (up & down). Neither surface ever requires chalking.
- You need not master all the calls to draw a turkey into range. Practice a single call—the yelp or cluck are good choices—until you have it right, then move on to the others.
- Practice indoors and outdoors and experiment with holding the call in different positions. The tones will be surprisingly different.
- Excessive heat could damage the call. Store out of direct sunlight. Never on the dashboard of a car or truck.
